Thank you for your interest in the Anthem.

Anthem. Music Fund Wales is a young charity that is just over five years old. We have been building our programmes swiftly across the last few years, including our FFWD>> Forum made up of 16 – 25 year olds who are passionate about music in Wales, the Atsain Fund focusing on removing barriers to music for young people in Wales, and our Anthem Gateway offering young people a first stop shop for developing their music in Wales.

The roles we are currently offering will support our activity programme including our FFWD>> Forum, skills workshops, and the role out of a new fund called Nurture. Successful candidates will be actively working with young people across Wales to support their development and running events, working closely with myself and our Programme Manager, Kofi.

Anthem is run by a small diverse team with some staff members on PAYE and some staff members working as freelancers. The team is supported by a committed group of trustees from a range of backgrounds. There is a strong emphasis on mutual support and it's important that everyone feels welcome, able to do their work to the best of their ability and has a chance to develop themselves when they come and work with Anthem. ABOUT ANTHEM

Anthem. Music Fund Wales Cronfa Gerdd Cymru was established in 2018 following a Welsh Government report exploring ways to support music education in Wales.

Our vision is a Wales in which music can empower every young life.

We believe music is a potent creative force for young people that feeds self-expression, personal development and wellbeing.

Anthem will create opportunities across genres and communities and nurture diverse talent to take the next steps to musical careers.

Anthem is a catalyst for youth music in Wales, funding work that will create change, making connections to widen partnership working, and enabling best practice to flourish.

Anthem seeks to ensure that equality and diversity principles – accessibility, inclusivity, respect and difference - underpin all areas of the organisation's work and aims to promote them within its board, its employment practices and across its work. Anthem positions its work as collaborative, innovative, inclusive, creative, inspiring.

ANTHEM PROGRAMMES

Anthem has developed a range of programmes over the last four years which are designed to support young people to engage with music and make pathways into music industry.

 Anthem FFWD>> recruits 15 young music professionals aged between 17 and 24 from across Wales to work with Anthem across a year. The group meets every two weeks on Zoom, expanding their

- knowledge of networks and exploring issues facing young people in Wales who want to get into music.
- Anthem Gateway is an online first-stop shop for any young person interested in music industry in Wales. Young people can access music opportunities, careers information, peer stories and links to music industry in Wales.
- Young Curators Cymru is a partnership project working with 4 partner venues to develop groups of young curators aged between 14 and 20 years old. The groups curate and run gigs in their local venues for peer audiences.
- Skills for Sustainability is a new programme of training sessions for young music creatives offering business skills development and routes into music-adjacent careers.
- The Nurture Fund is a new fund offering small grants to young musicians in Wales in need of financial support to take their music to the next level.

THE ROLES

We are currently seeking to appoint two Programme Assistants to support the delivery of programme activity across the next year.

The Programme Assistants will be working on the following projects:

- One Programme Assistant will work with the Anthem CEO to support the FFWD>> Youth Forum
- One Programme Assistant will work with the Anthem Programme Manager to support the Nurture Fund and Skills for Sustainability training programme.
